A meeting of the Durham Agricultural Advisory Committee was held on Tuesday, March 21, 2023 in the Council Chambers, Regional Headquarters Building, 605 Rossland Road East, Whitby, Ontario at 7:30 PM. Electronic participation was offered for this meeting.

A) Brenna Ireland, Partnership Manager, and Shane Jones, Farm Manager, The Barrett Centre, re: The Barrett Centre of Innovation in Sustainable Urban Agriculture

Brenna Ireland, Partnership Manager, and Shane Jones, Farm Manager, The Barrett Centre, provided a PowerPoint presentation with regards to The Barrett Centre of Innovation in Sustainable Urban Agriculture.

B. Ireland and S. Jones responded to questions with regards to the nature of the plot of land; whether the soil has been disturbed; the selection of the subject site; any hurdles regarding the process; types of fruits and vegetables that can be grown at the urban farm; and steps being taken for food security measures.

Discussion ensued with regards to the challenge of providing education to the community about agriculture.

B) Michael Scott, Project Planner, Region of Durham, re: Region of Durham Draft New Regional Official Plan

Michael Scott, Project Planner, Region of Durham, provided a PowerPoint Presentation with regards to Region of Durham Draft New Regional Official Plan.

Highlights of the presentation included:

- Envision Durham Draft Regional Official Plan
- Chapter 1 Regional Structure

- Chapter 9 Site Specific Policies
- Next Steps

M. Scott responded to questions with regards to the definition of bonafide farm in the draft new regional official plan; the process for lower tier municipalities following the regional official plan; whether municipalities can pass by-laws to override the regional official plan; how agriculture, agriculture related enterprise, and on farm diversified uses are incorporated into the regional official plan; and the requirement for agriculture impact assessments.

Discussion ensued with regards to bringing topsoil into Durham Region; the definition of a bonafide farmer within the Regional Official Plan and the impact on young farmers; development charges fees; how Bill 23 is affecting municipal planning; and when and how development charges will be required.

5. Discussion Items

A) Rural and Agricultural Economic Development Update

- S. Jibb provided the following update:
 - Currently working on providing Economic Development comments on the new draft Regional Official Plan.
 - Providing support to Durham Farm Connections for their open house on April 5, 2023 and obtaining permits from the Town of Whitby.
 - The on farm diversified uses toolkit is still in development, working with the consultant with an aim to provide an opportunity for local municipalities to review by mid-late April

B) Agriculture 101 Training

- S. Jibb advised that when the new committee members are appointed, the Agriculture 101 Training discussions will begin regarding the format of the presentations for presentation to the local municipalities.
- Z. Cohoon advised the Agriculture 101 presentation to Regional Council on March 1, 2023 was well received and provided an overview of questions received from Council during the presentation.

Discussion ensued with regards to best way to provide the presentation to the eight local municipalities.

C) 2023 Farm Tour Sub-Committee Report

- D. Risebrough provided the following update:
 - The farm tour is being held on September 21, 2023 at Carncroft Farm and Swain Beef.
 - A subcommittee meeting will take place before the next committee meeting and there will be an on-site meeting at the farms to review the set up.
- M. Scott advised that the "save the dates" for the farm tour were sent to Regional and local Councils and will be sent to Members of Provincial Parliament shortly. He also advised that the tent and bathroom rentals have been confirmed, and he has received the quote for hats.

D) ROPA 2023-001 – Bethesda Ridge Farms, Municipality of Clarington

M. Scott advised that an application to amend the Durham Regional Official Plan, submitted by Clark Consulting Services, on behalf of Bethesda Ridge Farms, to permit the severance of a farm dwelling rendered surplus as a result of the

consolidation of non-abutting farm properties in the Municipality of Clarington, File: OPA 2023-001, was received.

- M. Scott advised that the applicant is requesting to sever the existing farm dwelling which is not required for a farm employee and is surplus to the farm operation. He also advised that a concurrent zoning by-law amendment application has been submitted to the Municipality of Clarington to rezone the retained farm parcel to prohibit any further severances and the development of any new dwellings, and the use of the existing barn for housing livestock.
- M. Scott provided a brief overview of the application and discussion ensued regarding the subject site.

Moved by D. Risebrough, Seconded by H. Schillings
That the Durham Agricultural Advisory Committee has no objections to the severance of land.

E) ROPA 2023-002 – Thornlea Holsteins Ltd., Municipality of Clarington

- M. Scott advised that an application to amend the Durham Official Plan, submitted by Clark Consulting Services, on behalf of Thornlea Holsteins Ltd., to permit the severance of a farm dwelling rendered surplus as a result of the consolidation of non-abutting farm properties in the Municipality of Clarington, File: OPA 2023-002, was received.
- M. Scott advised that Thornlea Holsteins Ltd. owns of total of five agricultural properties in the Municipality of Clarington with present land holdings of 175.5 hectares, of which 149.3 hectares are workable. He also advised that the applicant purchased the subject site in 2022, that the lands are used for the farm's feed crop operation, and the house located on the subject site is not utilized by a farm employee and is surplus to the farm operation.
- M. Scott provided a brief overview of the application and discussion ensued regarding the subject site.

That the Durham Agricultural Advisory Committee has no objections to
the severance of land.

A) Proposed Updates to the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Normal Farm Practices Protection Board (NFPPB)

A link to the Proposed Updates to the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Normal Farm Practices Protection Board (NFPPB) was provided as Attachment #2 to the Agenda and received.

M. Scott advised that the proposed changes include supporting public participation by clarifying access to adjudicative records, processes for electronic hearings, opportunities for the public to attend hearings, providing efficient and timely proceedings such as when to dismiss applications without a hearing, and optimizing board proceedings. He also advised that comments must be submitted by April 3, 2023.

B) <u>Envision Durham – Release of the Draft New Regional Official Plan</u>

Report #2023-P-6 of the Commissioner of Planning and Economic Development – Envision Durham – Release of the Draft New Regional Official Plan was provided as Attachment #3 to the Agenda and received.

7. Other Business

A) Avian Influenza in Poultry

H. Schillings raised concerns with regards to the avian influenza effecting poultry in Durham Region. Discussion ensued with regards to the avian influenza and the possibility of a motion from DAAC on this matter.

Council of the Region of Durham, at its meeting held on March 01, 2023, adopted the following resolution:

Whereas the agri-food industry is one of the top economic drivers in Durham Region supporting a workforce of over 27,105 people through 3,360 agri-food businesses, more than 1,200 farms and farm families, contributing upwards of \$354 million to Ontario's total farm production and supporting \$775 million in GDP;

And Whereas food prices have seen their steepest increase since 1981 with a year over year increase of 11% as of October 2022;

And Whereas inputs for farmers and primary producers have increased significantly in the last year, including fertilizer prices increasing 95.8% compared to July 2020, fuel prices have seen a historic year-over-year increase, while chemical/herbicide markets have experienced shortages and increased prices. Despite these changes, farmers have not seen a significant increase in their primary product price to compensate for the rising cost of inputs;

And Whereas the profit margin for farmers was adversely impacted by a 35% tariff placed on fertilizer imports, including fertilizer purchased prior to economic sanctions being placed on Russia and Belarus that farmers in Canada rely on to support food production.

Now therefore be it resolved that the Durham Agricultural Advisory Committee requests that Regional Council recognize the importance of agriculture in Durham Region by encouraging the federal government to compensate farmers for tariffs paid on fertilizer, one of the contributing factors to increased food costs.

RE: Motion Regarding Bill C-234: An Act to Amend the Greenhouse Gas Pollution Pricing Act, Our File: A01

Council of the Region of Durham, at its meeting held on March 29, 2023, adopted the following resolution:

Whereas Bill C-234 (An Act to Amend the Greenhouse Gas Pollution Pricing Act) proposes an amendment to the Federal government's carbon pricing legislation to provide carbon tax exemptions for natural gas and propane used on farm for grain drying and barn heating.

Whereas agriculture is one of the key economic drivers in Durham Region, with oilseed and grain farming representing the largest share of total farms in the Region.

Whereas there are currently no economically viable options other than fossil fuels for on-farm grain drying in Ontario in the short-term.

Whereas, without short-term relief from the Greenhouse Gas Pollution Pricing Act, there will be increased pressure on the cost of food production and ultimately an increase in food prices to consumers.

Therefore, be it resolved that Durham Region Council send a letter to the Federal Government including Durham's Members of Federal Parliament, the Federal Minister of Environment and Climate Change, Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM), the Mayors and Regional Chairs of Ontario (MARCO) and the Federal Minister of Agriculture and Agri-food to express support for Bill C-234.
