Just a few short weeks before the much-anticipated Oct. 4 release of his fifth studio album *Fire & Brimstone* via The Valory Music Co., **Brantley Gilbert**, billed as an artist who "never fails to deliver" by *American Songwriter*, is already looking for opportunities to bring the music to his faithful BG Nation with a brand new 2020 tour. *Fire't Up Tour*, aptly named after track one on his upcoming 15-song album (all written/co-written by Gilbert), will kick off Jan. 23 in London, Ontario and hit 34 cities across the country and Canada, including a stop in Oshawa at the Tribute Communities Centre on January 24, 2020.
