Millennium Square Stargazing and Telescope Donation Unveiling Ceremony

The Royal Astronomical Society of Canada, Toronto Centre (RASC) and Durham Skies Astronomy will be donating an astronomical telescope to the Pickering Public Library (PPL). The unveiling will take place on Friday, September 6, 7:00 pm at Millennium Square, during RASC's free public stargazing event.

RASC, Durham Skies and PPL invite everyone to join for the unveiling ceremony and free stargazing at the edge of Lake Ontario. The public can observe through different kinds of telescopes (including solar-filtered scopes) to get close-up looks at sunspots, craters on the Moon, and planets visible in the current night sky. Event attendees will be able to peer into deep space and try their hand at spotting faint star clusters and nebulae. The public can attend with their own telescopes and receive expert advice from RASC on how to use it better.
