The taste is quite often compared to a cross between raspberry and blueberry, with a vitamin C zing. Haskap berries are high in Vitamin C and A, fiber, and potassium. Specifically they have three tim es the antioxidants of a blueberry, similar amount of vitamin C to an orange and almost as much potassium as a banana. They are extremely high in antioxi dants such as Anthocyanins, Poly Phenols, and Bioflavanoids.
