#### 6. Presentations

## 6.1 R.J. Kyle, Commissioner and Medical Officer of Health, re: COVID-19 Update

R.J. Kyle, Commissioner and Medical Officer of Health provided a PowerPoint Presentation with regards to the COVID-19 Update. A copy of the PowerPoint was provided to members in advance of the meeting.

R.J. Kyle provided an overview of the current status of the pandemic as well as statistics related to the status of cases and current outbreaks. He stated that as of May 2, 2021, the number of reported COVID-19 cases has been consistently below 200. He provided statistics related to active outbreaks in Long-Term Care Homes, retirement homes and hospitals; schools and childcare; and workplaces and community events.

With regards to vaccinations, R.J. Kyle advised that the total doses of vaccines administered as of May 4<sup>th</sup> is 219,698. He stated that the channels of delivery include community and hospital clinics, mobile clinics, primary care, hot spot popup clinics and hot spot mobile clinics. He further advised that Durham Region is currently in Phase 2 of the provincial plan and provided an overview of the priority groups currently eligible for the first dose of the vaccine.

R.J. Kyle stated that the five hot spot communities in Ajax and Pickering were identified by the province as they have been impacted significantly by COVID-19. In planning for hot spot clinics, he stated that the Health Department considered: community demographics; COVID-19 positivity rates; number of outbreaks and total cases; at-risk determinants; and current vaccination resources. He advised that the hot spot vaccination strategy has 2 components; clinics operated by the Regional Municipality of Durham consisting of mass immunization clinics, pop up rotational clinics and mobile clinics; as well as delivery channels operated by community partners consisting of Durham College/Ontario Tech University Mass Immunization Clinic, pop up fixed clinic at Ajax Community Centre, pharmacies, primary care, and workplace clinics.

R.J. Kyle thanked the Health Department for their efforts during the pandemic.

Staff responded to questions with regards to the possibility of mobile or rotational clinic testing; and the provincial announcement regarding more vaccinations and its effect on Durham Region.

Approval to Award a Sole Source Contract for Supply and Delivery of Nestle Dysphagia Dietary Products for use by the Region of Durham's four (4) Long-Term Care Homes

#### Recommendation:

That the Health and Social Services Committee recommends to Regional Council:

- A) That the Regional Municipality of Durham enter into a sole source contract with Nestle Health Sciences at a total estimated cost not to exceed \$240,000 (before applicable taxes) for a three (3) year period for the supply of dysphagia products for the Region of Durham's four (4) Long-Term Care Homes to be financed from the 2021 approved and future years' Social Services Business Plans and Budgets; and
- B) That the Commissioner of Finance be authorized to execute any necessary documents related to this sole source agreement.

#### Report:

#### 1. Purpose

1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide details and seek approval to award a sole source contract to Nestle Health Sciences for the procurement of dysphagia dietary products for the Region of Durham's four (4) Long-Term Care Homes (LTCH) for a three (3) year period.

## 2. Background

2.1 In accordance with the *Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007*, there must be an organized program of nutrition and dietary services for the LTCHs as well as an organized program of hydration for the LTHCs to meet the needs of residents. Every resident must receive food and fluids that are safe, adequate in quantity, nutritious and varied.

- 2.2 Approximately fifteen (15) percent of residents residing in the Region's LTCHs experience swallowing disorders. When eating and drinking become difficult, residents are at risk for choking or aspiration pneumonia, as well as dehydration and malnutrition. Foods and fluids must be thickened with specialized products to be safely consumed.
- 2.3 Since 2011, all four (4) LTCHs have been purchasing dysphagia products from Nestle Health Sciences.

#### 3. Justification for Sole Source

- 3.1 Nestle Food Science has been providing dysphagia dietary products to the four (4) LTCHs for 10 years. The homes are satisfied with the quality of the products.
- 3.2 Any new vendor's product would require extensive time for product evaluation, new recipe development and testing, staff training and education both on the use and clinical record documentation. It is imperative that there is no interruption to service and / or safety to residents requiring dysphagia products.

## 4. Financial Implications

- 4.1 The Region of Durham's Purchasing By-law #16-2020, Section 7 permits the acquisition of goods and services through sole source negotiations. The by-law also requires approval by the standing committee and Council for the award of sole source contracts that exceed \$100,000 in value.
  - a. Appendix C, Article 1.1: Permitted if the goods or services can be supplied by a particular supplier and no reasonable alternative or substitute goods or services exist for any of the following reasons: To ensure compatibility with existing goods, or to maintain specialized goods that must be maintained by the manufacturer of those goods or its representative.
- 4.2 The total estimated cost of \$240,000\* for a three (3) year term will continue to be included in the annual Business Plans and Budgets for each Long Term Care Home at no additional cost.
- 4.3 As an additional benefit to the Region of Durham, Nestle Health Science is offering an estimated total dollar rebate of approximately \$30,000\* to the Region over the three (3) year term.

Note: Dollar amounts followed by an asterisk (\*) are before applicable taxes.

#### 5. Relationship to Strategic Plan

5.1 This report aligns with/addresses the following strategic goals and priorities in the Durham Region Strategic Plan:

a. Goal #5 – Service Excellence – Optimize resources and partnerships to deliver exceptional quality services and value.

#### 6. Conclusion

- 6.1 It is recommended that authorization be granted to award a three (3) year Contract with Nestle Health Sciences for the supply of dysphagia dietary products for the Region of Durham's four (4) Long-Term Care Homes.
- 6.2 This report has been reviewed by the Finance Department and the Commissioner of Finance concurs with the financial recommendations.
